



Alstom honoured with the Nógrád County Chamber of Commerce award for Palócföld's Economy in Hungary

- Alstom was selected in the category of large size companies operating in the country for its outstanding contribution to the region's economic development
- Alstom's site in Mátranovák employs more than 650 people and also trains welders and fitters on several training levels in its world class training centre
- The company is investing HUF 1.3 billion this year to expand the product portfolio and production capacity of the Nógrád county plant

24 November 2022 – Alstom, global leader in smart and sustainable mobility, has been honoured by the Nógrád County Chamber of Commerce with the Palócföld's Economy award. The Nógrád County Chamber of Commerce has recognised the company's achievements in supporting the economic development of the Nógrád county region as well as its future oriented approach. Alstom has played an important role in strengthening the performance and innovation capacity of the Hungarian economy, thanks to its continuous development and investments in its Mátranovák site.

For four decades, Alstom's Mátranovák site has been producing bogie frames for metro trains and railway wagons, on which axles, springs and brakes are mounted, therefore their quality is crucial for railway safety. Mátranovák's bogie frames manufacturing involves highly sophisticated and combined welding techniques.

To meet the high-quality standards required, Alstom has established its own world-class training centre, where several people have learned welding and fitting with the help of experienced master welders. The centre's reputation is demonstrated by the fact that it already trains building- and scaffolding master fitters and would expand its training programmes to include other professions in the future, in cooperation with the national and county chambers of commerce.

"Innovation and continuous quality assurance are inseparable requirements at Alstom. The "Made in Mátranovák" label has become a guarantee for the reliability of the components manufactured here, which also indicates that the site is a top performer and has been successfully integrated into the company's European network. We have achieved this result with the support of the local community, in cooperation with professional organisations, and we are proud to receive this award from the County Chamber of Commerce," said Gáspár Balázs, CEO of Alstom Transport Hungary Zrt. and Managing Director of Alstom in Hungary.

This year, thanks to continuous investment and development, the range of bogie frames that are produced for various rolling stocks, conventional and high-speed trains, suburban trains, locomotives and double deckers has been extended. The site in Nógrád county is now also producing this important component for hydrogen-powered trains such as the Coradia iLint, which are a major innovation in rail transport. The world's first hydrogen train, the Coradia iLint manufactured by Alstom, has been in commercial service since 2018 and recently entered passenger service on the world's first 100 percent hydrogen-powered route in Bremervörde, Lower Saxony.



"With the Palócföld Economy Award, we would like to recognise not only Alstom's past achievements but also the company's contribution to the future of the region's economy. The company is providing a secure livelihood and career opportunities for hundreds of families and future professionals through continuous expansions, the creation of new jobs and improvements in the training centre. Alstom is a major player in Hungarian rail transport: there are 27 Traxx locomotives running in Hungary, and the company has also upgraded 59 MÁV-Start trains to meet the strict European standards ETCS board equipment, enabling these trains to reach a top speed of 160 km/h, more safely and efficiently than before. Alstom's Mátranovák site currently employs more than 650 people and have open positions to fill, offering stable, sustainable jobs with multiple career opportunities. In its own training centre, the company, in cooperation with the county and national chambers of commerce, provides world-class trainings and great career opportunities in two niche professions - welding and locksmithing. The company hopes that the uptake of hydrogen trains will usher in a new era of rail transport worldwide with the Hungarian community's involvement.
